What is a pronoun?

Pronouns are words that an individual wants people to use when talking about them. These may include

- He/him/his
- She/her/hers
- They/them/theirs
- A combination of the above (For example, She/them/theirs)

Why do pronouns matter?

It is important to be aware that we can't always tell someone's gender by looking at them. For those who identify as transgender, gender diverse and sexually diverse, or non-binary being misgendered, misnamed, or frequently questioned about their gender, or intersex variation can lead to feelings of exclusion and discrimination. It is for this reason that it is important to be aware that we cannot assume someone's pronouns, gender, and sexual identity.

To provide a supportive service and an inclusive work environment, using the correct pronoun can make someone feel safe and welcome within our organisation.

Banyule Community Health is committed to ensuring our service is a safe and supportive environment for trans, gender and sexuallydiverse, non-binary, and intersex staff, volunteers, students and consumers.

As part of this commitment, we are introducing the option to include pronouns in staff email signatures.
